Before the Coffee Gets Cold by Toshikazu Kawaguchi and Geoffrey Trousselot

This was a marmite book - the room was split between those that liked the book and those that didn't. Interestingly there was also a split between those that listened to audio version and those that read it - reading it seemed to be easier because you could get to grips with the Japanese names and multiple characters.

Getting to grips with the characters and how they were all related was an issue and we discussed the fact that the translator's job is very hard and if it isn't done well then you can lose something of the original text, particularly the cultural aspects.

Against the book was that rules of time travel were repeated a lot and this felt forced and it felt a bit clumsy (though this could have been the translation). On the plus side of the book it was warm, it showed a community loving and supporting each other. The journey / story with the character who had Alzheimers was insightful and caring.
