Christmas walk and lunch Thurs 5th Dec 2024 Exireuil and Reffannes

Note to all - this event is on a Thursday.

Two walks will be available on the 5th, a 30 mins and a 1:30 hrs walk. Please arrive in Exircuil (79400) for a 10:30 start.

The short walk is very easy with a mix of country lanes and a very small stretch of road (but there is very little traffic). The longer walk has the same mix of terrain, with the added feature of a couple of up and down sections. Wear walking boots as the weather is unpredictable!

Coffee and teas will be available to the short walkers at chez Annette, plus a warming fire (if necessary

(b) to wait for the other walkers return or you can go directly to Le Dix Vingt in Raffannes, they are open from 9:00 hrs.

The restaurant is approximately 15 mins away from the walk location, lunch is booked for 13:00 hrs, the walk should finish by 12:30 at the latest.

The restaurant is the same as last year, the popular Le Dix-Vingt, 14 Avenue de la Grande auberge, Reffannes, 79420. It offers superb value with its all inclusive menu.

The two menus are listed below, Le Gourmand and Le Végétarien both are €32 and include, tea, coffee, still water, plus bottles of red, rose and white wine. As it's Christmas it would be great to see as many Christmas jumpers or hats on display plus we will be giving away two bottles of champagne in our free raffle.

Reading Grp Wed 27 Nov L'Embruinière report by Michele Hansford

Our chosen book this month was Remarkable Creatures by Tracy Chevalier, a fictionalised retelling of the fossil discoveries for which Lyme Regis is now famous. It is only when reading a book such as this that we can begin to see how difficult life was for women in the 19th century and for those men and women who had no money, little education and no rights. This is the remarkable story of a poor woman who struggled against both these constraints, aided by another, richer woman and uncovered remains of the prehistoric world which cast doubt on the accepted story of creation. A definite recommendation by our group.
